


application and intention	<p>A placemat is valuable if the thoughts of different team members have to be noted down and a pool of many ideas should be created. This method can be used in nearly all subjects. It will support the cognitive learning of students.</p>
material and examples	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A pencil for every member (3-5 members)• A group table• The poster(placemat)
types of placemats	<div style="display: flex; flex-direction: column; align-items: center;"><div style="display: flex; align-items: center;">4</div><div style="display: flex; align-items: center; margin-top: 20px;">5</div></div>
how to do a placemat	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The team joins around a table.2. In the middle they have their placemat.3. Each team member owns one field. Into this field he enters his own thoughts and ideas to the topic/keywords. (10 minutes)4. Afterwards the members exchange their ideas and thoughts and maybe develop a list with the most important points (ranking). Here they need to discuss and convince their other partners.
control	<p>The task could be to develop a poster with a ranking of only limited numbers of points. This way the students will have to look more closely behind each idea and evaluate it.</p>
